What makes our sport different from all the others are the surprise results.

And that is what actually happened in London last **September 12 at the Lancaster Hotel Hyde Park.** 

WBC International 168lbs Silver champion Serhat Güler (Tuyrkey) lost his belt against Argentina's Martin Ezequiel Bulacio by TKO.

When the fight started, it seemed that everything was going in the best way for the champion who, with his usual impetuosity, won the first round and even more clearly the second scoring a flashing knockdown.

But the courageous and brave challenger had no intention of giving up and, from the third round, he began with his revenge.

Not at all demoralized for the visit to the canvas in round two, Bulacio began to properly box the champion in the third round when he was very close of having the defending champion on the verge of a knockdown.

From that moment on, an unstoppable Bulacio won all the subsequent rounds. At the end of round six Bulacio was leading for one point on two cards, while the third judge had one point for Güler.

(personally, I believe that Bulacio won all rounds from the third on).

If we think that in the seventh round Bulacio scored a knockdown in his favor, the bout was clearly heading towards a surprising victory for the South American boxer and the referee did very well to stop the bout at 2'58" of that session.

Güler was clearly showing he had no energy left.

Great victory for the Argentine boxer, great disappointment for the Turkish team. Promoter Ahmet Öner seems now intent on organizing a title bout between Bulacio and full titlist Luka Plantic.

That would be a great match.

We are all loking forward to a confirmation.
